MESSAGE FROM THE LEADERSHIP TEAM - DIRECTOR & PRINCIPAL



We hope you are enjoying the summer and will find time to spend with your kids. The school team is recharging the batteries to prepare for an exciting, new academic year. The leadership and the administration team are busy laying hands on the last preparations for the next academic year.

ACADEMIC YEAR 2023-24

We are happy that we have been successful in implementing the ICSE and MYP programmes from grade 6 and have also completed the affiliation process with ICSE. We are now eagerly waiting for the IB authorisation visit in the last week of July. The team has worked tirelessly and we are hopeful of getting the authorisation soon after the visit is completed.

This academic year, we have strived hard to establish and align all academic processes to the two boards. We have completed the curricular demands, organised summative assessments, and completed bridge courses to ensure that the learners are ready for the challenges of the new grades.

We know the curriculum and test challenges have not been easy for the learners. Fully aligning to the two board curricula was a new experience. However, we are sure the learners will get used to the combination of academic rigour and CBS's holistic approach.

We will continue to support all our learners in achieving academic excellence. We believe that the quality of staff has a powerful and meaningful effect on learners and hence we have further streamlined the staff selection process. We have recruited competent teachers with experience in both ICSE and IB for the new year. We are hopeful this will further foster student learning.

Because of the affiliation processes, we have focussed on aligning our pedagogical processes to the Board's demands. However, CBS is only successful if we succeed in pursuing academic excellence and leadership. We have inserted the leadership pillars in the lesson plans to ensure we develop leadership simultaneously with educational goals. We have continued problem-based learning this year in a slightly different format. Once again, seeing and hearing our students present their projects was impressive.

In the Annual Day performances, where all the learners had a role, the leadership pillars were at the centre of the narrative. We have started an internship program, where learners visited companies during the winter break and now again during the summer break. Even the field trips, where the children collaborate and overcome fear when participating in outdoor activities, are crucial to developing the learners' leadership potential.

Our learners' afterschool clubs on Thursdays and Fridays were successful. We are happy that we had clubs in various areas and that nearly all our learners participated. We are currently running the summer program and we are happy to share that the initial feedback has been very encouraging and reassuring.

ACADEMIC YEAR 2024-25

We have achieved many of our academic year 2023-24 goals. We are now planning for an even better 2024-25. The foundation is a well-thought-through year plan that balances academic excellence, co-curricular activities and leadership pillars.

Here are some of the initiatives we will present in the academic year 2024-25:

The middle school leadership academy will be held regularly featuring speakers who have exhibited exemplary leadership in their domains. We are certain this exposure will inspire our learners to aspire more and dream big.

The PBL exhibition continues to be our flagship program. In 2024-25, we will combine our experience from previous years and create small subject projects and large interdisciplinary projects.

Clubs will continue with some modifications so that student agency and student ownership get further enhanced. On popular request from our parents and students, we plan to introduce a Debate Club and a MUN Club (Model United Nations) next year. We will support the Student Leadership Council to become an active partner in developing the school and its culture.

We admit that we have faced challenges with completing the sports ground, but we are now happy that the work is in progress and should be ready for the academic year 2024-25.

Our new cafeteria will serve all our learners sumptuous, balanced, and hygienic food. We will share the menu with the parents one week ahead. We feel that having the children eat together adds to the school community.

We know that there are many different opinions about school uniforms. However, to encourage House and school spirit, we intend to introduce House colour T-shirts which our learners will be expected to wear on a specified weekday, special occasions and for sports day.

Next year, we will once again add one more class, grade 10. We will also have more learners in the other classes. To enhance learning, we will add new furniture and learning resources to the open learning areas. Furthermore, we will improve our science labs and the innovation lab. We will also have more books in the library.
