

FROM THE DESK OF THE DIRECTOR



Our new principal, Shalini Singh Hamilton will join us soon. She was expected to have joined us already. However, her joining has been postponed due to a family emergency. We are excited to welcome her from the beginning of the next academic year. Shalini is an experienced school leader and comes to us from her previous position as the principal of The Gaudium School in Hyderabad.

I will continue as the school's director and focus on vision and strategy, while Shalini will be responsible for the operational leadership of the school. We will work closely together to ensure the quality of our academic deliveries and the implementation of our vision and pedagogical approaches.

In July, we will have information meetings with the parents, where they can meet Shalini and learn more about the school's plans.

We have almost completed our first typical academic year. Throughout the year, we have implemented academic systems and operations, and we have introduced events and activities that will be part of next year's plan. We believe in our pedagogical approach that respects each child's learning journey and sets goals step-by-step while keeping the end goal in mind. We do not pressure our learners beyond their abilities because we believe it can harm their future learning.

As the summer vacation is approaching, it can be a long time away from school and friends for many learners. I hope the parents find time to spend with their children throughout the year. If your child needs structured activities during the summer vacation, we introduce the CBS Summer Camp from May 3 to 16. The camp offers sports activities (Badminton, Skating, Table Tennis, Swimming, Football, Basketball), Music (Guitar, Drums, Keyboard, Vocals), Visual Arts, Dance, Theatre, and IT (iPad adaptation, Robotics/AI). The Summer Camp will provide a safe, fun, and skill-based experience, and the children can sign up for one or more of these activities. We will send a brochure with more information shortly.

The Summer Camp will also give a glimpse of what to expect when we introduce after-school clubs in the coming academic year.

AI LAB LAUNCH



REVIVAL CAMP, ON-CAMPUS LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME - GRADE 3 & 4

We recently organised an on-campus Leadership Programme for our Grades 3 and 4 learners. The programme was organised in collaboration with Travandre. The aim of the programme was to provide students with hands-on experience in a real setting and to develop relevant skills.

The programme started with a welcome drink, post which the students were then divided into groups and introduced to their instructors and volunteers. The first activity of the programme was the basic techniques of knots and camping. The instructors demonstrated different types of knot techniques, tent pitching, shelter building and first aid skills. The students constructed temporary shelters and learned about basic camping techniques. They also participated in pottery, obstacle courses, and fun games.
